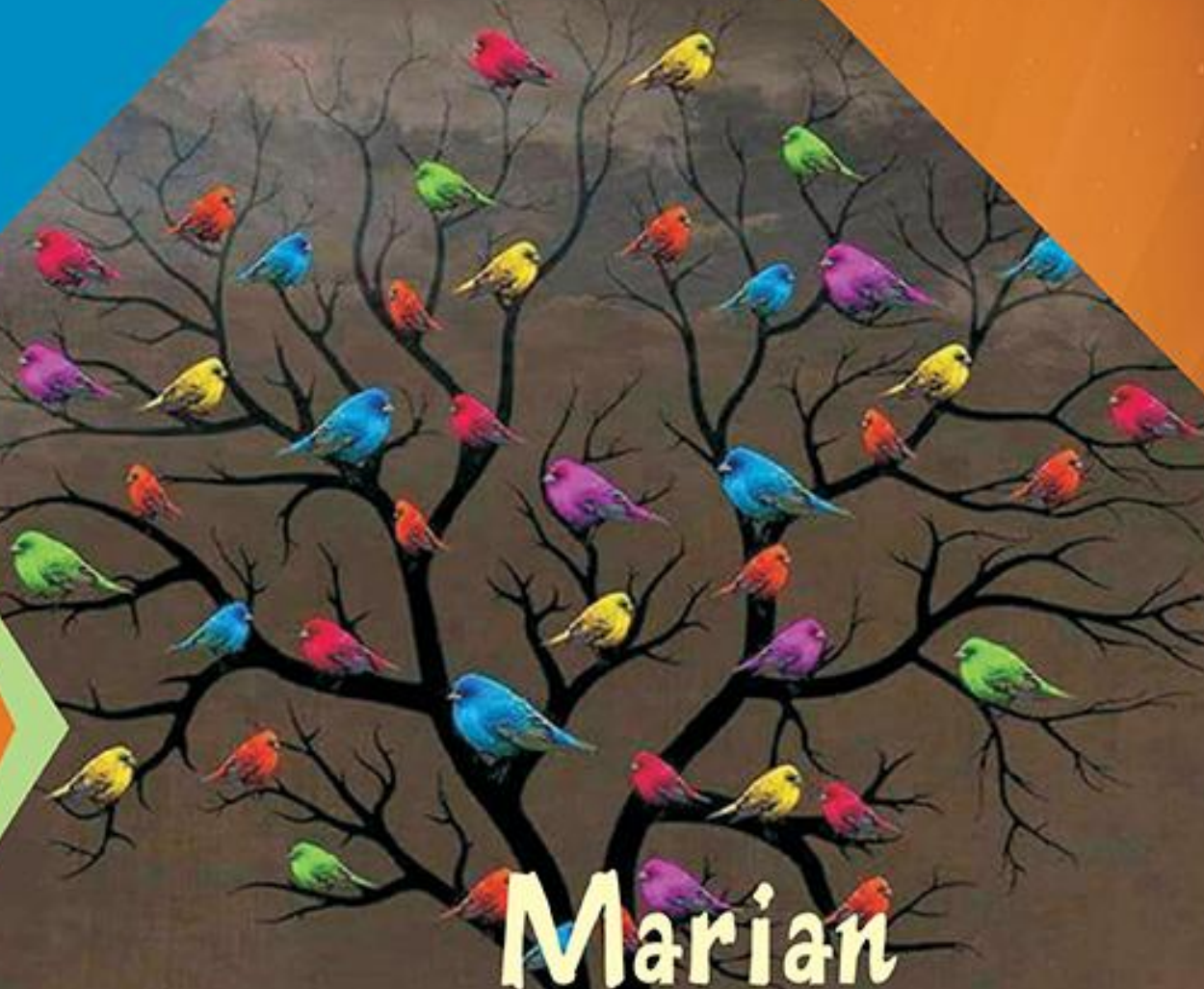

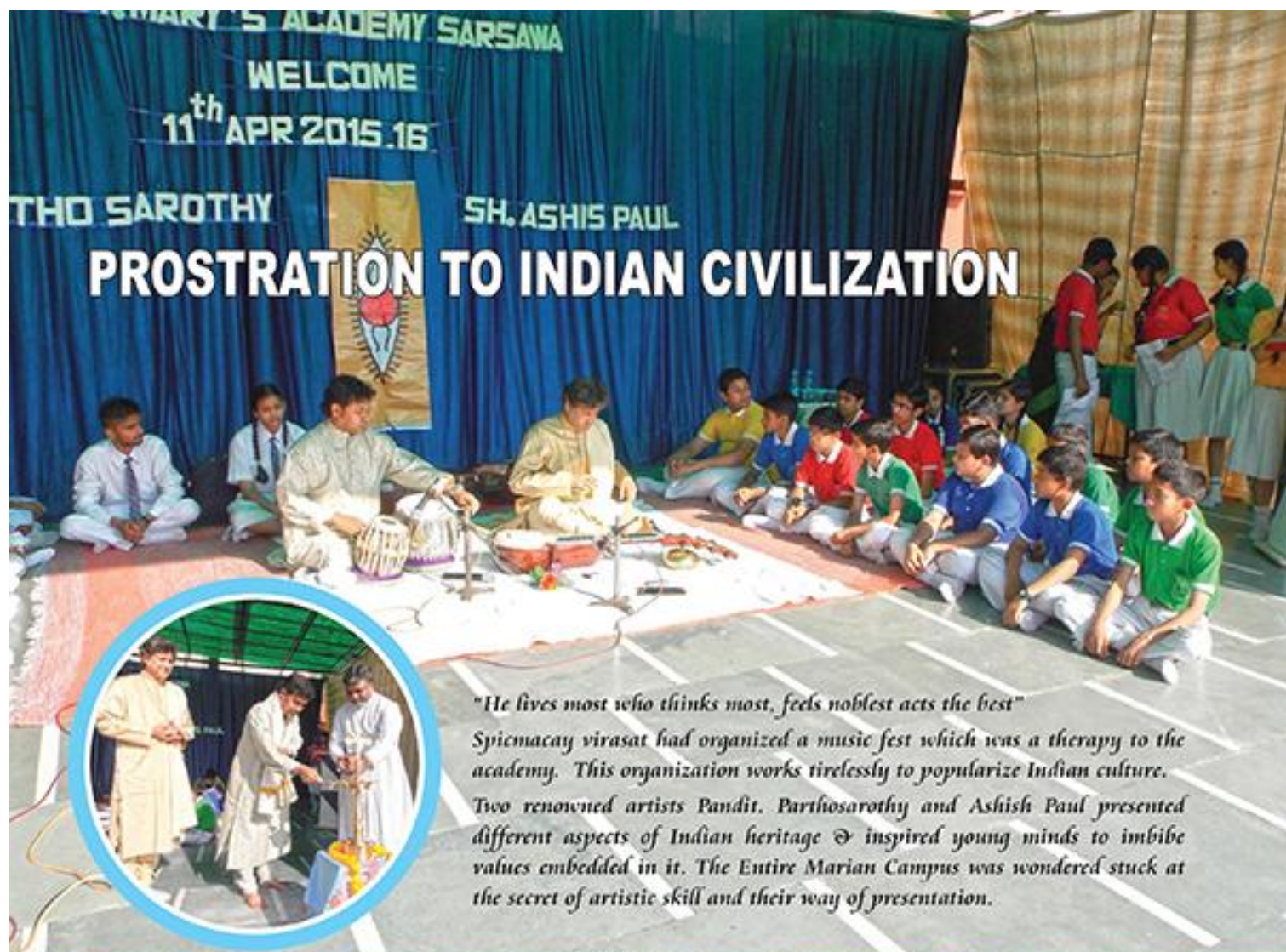
CULTURAL FIESTA

By the grace of our Lord and the mutual efforts of his people a small gathering started coming together at Mr. Benson Singh's residence (a local Christian) for the Holy Mass. This group comprised of the then 2-3 local families and a few ARC and the Air force families. In spite of the thin number and all the difficulties Lord's holy men namely Rev. Fr. Umedeus, Rev. Father James, Rev. Father Pinto, Bishop Patrick Nair kept coming and offered Holy mass at the residence of Mr. Singh.

This determination to praise was blessed when in the early 70's land was bought for building a chapel and school for the locals under Bishop Patrick Nair and Rev. Fr. Puthet. The construction took place well in order under Rev. Father Lawrence (1990-97). Now the tiny congregation had a place to come together and faithfully praise the most high. This construction was just a step climbed onto the ladder of blessings and graces that the Lord had planned. Rev. Fr. Lawrence strongly believed in timely house visits and occasional Church get together. This strengthened the mutual understanding of the people and the priest which laid the foundation of the Church. Hence, the repeated requests of the people got answered when under the Rev. Fr. Lawrence the holy Church got built in the early 90's for fulfilling the holy purpose of our Lord. This was indeed a dream come true for the people.

The congregation increased slowly but steadily. And the bond people shared developed with each year to great heights under Rev. Fr. Carson (1997-98). During his short span of service Rev. Fr. This progressing success was in itself and achievements for the pioneers like Bishop Patrick Nair who understood the requirement and channelized the blessing in the form of this Church.

But then even a diamond needs to be cut with precision and adjusted with fitness as to make known its true grandeur.

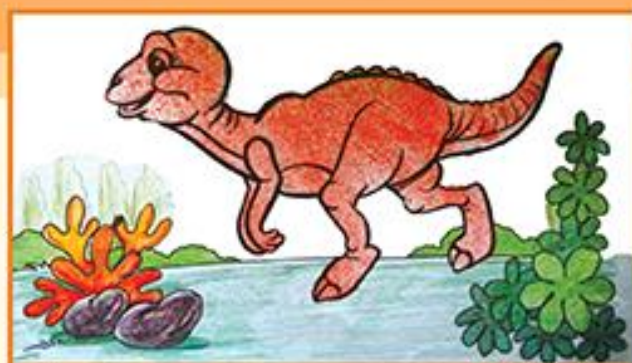
